1098-T Reporting Changes and Updates

The IRS had mandated that schools begin reporting Box 1 (payments) on 1098-T tax statements rather than Box 2 (amounts billed) starting with the 2017 tax year, however this has been delayed for another year. Despite the delay, this significant change is still

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supposed to go into effect in 2018. This new requirement will affect many schools as it is estimated 85% of schools in higher education report in Box 2. There are additional changes being mandated, and having to make these changes, particularly the Box 1 reporting, is a huge burden on a school’s IT staff, as they need to update their systems to properly track payments going toward qualified tuition and fees. The changes will be covered along with tips to ensure compliance as it relates to student Tax ID Numbers.

Collecting on accounts that are past the statute of limitations or ‘time barred’ pose unique challenges and involve risk. Some choose to avoid the pursuit of these types of accounts altogether because of this. Though it may not be against the law to communicate with an out-of-statue account, your language, verbal or written, must not insinuate you hold an enforceable claim. Federal courts have held that collecting time barred accounts may violate the FDCPA for a variety of theories. We’ll discuss these cases and other collection avenues for older accounts.
